Age Restrictions On Social Media

Social media age restrictions are there for a reason. Users of social media need to be safe and responsible. The issues that St Mary's school staff have spent time dealing with this week prove to us again that many primary school children are not yet acting safely online, are not taking responsibility for their behaviour and have therefore not met the level of maturity required to use such

At St Mary's we teach children regularly about being safe online. We have taught them how to report others both online and through parents and staff. We have held training for parents on the issues facing them in the digital age, sadly though, this was very poorly attended. However we still have so many pupils with social media accounts, many of which their parents are aware of.

"Everyone else does it and I don't want to be left out" is not a good enough reason. If your children hear you agreeing with that argument or you allow them to use that excuse, how will you expect them to react any differently when they and their friends are eventually offered cigarettes, alcohol, drugs, to skip school or a casual sexual experience? Doing something you know is wrong or harmful is not acceptable just because others are doing it. Sometimes we have to be strong enough to take a stand in the face of opposition simply because it is the right thing to do.

This week we have been dealing with some cyber bullying which happened outside of school hours, often late at night. None of us can (or should) be with our children 100% of the time but we do need to teach them how to be responsible and how to make good decisions for themselves when we are not with them.

We were really disappointed in the actions of some of our pupils and ask that you all please start a conversation with your children about these issues and plan your family rules. It is never too early to open this discussion. Get to know the different sites and how they are used. Make an account for yourselves (e.g. Snapchat, WhatsApp or Instagram) to learn about it before allowing your child to sign up. If any parent would like help in finding out about these accounts, the security settings or any issues encountered, please feel free to contact school where we will be happy to help.

Should my child be on social media?

Parents can sometimes feel the pressure of pester power to allow their children on social media, even if they don't feel comfortable doing so.

While these services are a fun way to stay connected with others, there can be downsides like cyberbullying, risks to privacy and contact from strangers.

If you allow your child to sign up to a social media service, consider these handy tips.



Report

–show your child how to report inappropriate content, especially cyberbullying.

Join in

 create an account yourself and find out what your child is likely to encounter.



Talk

– maintain open communication with your child so they feel safe talking to you about any concerns.


Reminder Drop in session
