In English, we have been reading *Weslandia* by Paul Fleischman (look at Seesaw to find a video of me reading the book).

Can you design a shelter for Wesley to live in? Think about how you will keep Wesley sheltered from the weather, how you will provide Wesley with comfort and warmth. You can draw a picture of your shelter or you could have a go at building a shelter. You can then upload a picture of your shelter to Seesaw.

Please ensure you are reading for at least 20 minutes each day.

Maths

In Maths, we will look at rounding decimal numbers. Ask a parent for a recent receipt from a shopping trip - the longer the better! Look at the prices - these are written as decimal numbers. Pick two items and compare these numbers using the language 'greater than' and 'less than'. Take each item and round it to the nearest 10p or tenth. Then round it to the nearest £ or unit.

e.g. bread was £1.29, milk was £1.18.

£1.29 > £1.18,

Rounding to 10p: £1.29 = £1.30, £1.18 = £1.20

Rounding to £1: £1.29 = £1 £1.18 = £1.00

Please ensure you are practising your times tables for at least 20 minutes a day.
