

	Make sure that you are dressed appropriately and eaten breakfast!
Session 2	as The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe by C.S. Lewis (attached).  Find examples of figurative language – words, phrases and sentences that appeal to the senses and help to create a picture of the setting in your mind's eye. Cut out examples of words, phrases and sentences and explore ways of reordering, editing and listing them. Add extra words and phrases to create a new narrative or word collage.  This is a good way for you to look at how language is similar across different texts, and encourages you to create something new from existing material.  Figurative language is a technique used by writers to appeal to readers' senses, because it
	makes them look at the world in a different or more imaginative way. Figurative language includes metaphors, similes and personification.
