

Modal verbs express the possibility of an event happening. The adverbial clauses we will use shall answer the question How?

During Lent, we spend time focusing on aligning our hearts closer to God. We give up treats to enable us to spend time and resources helping others.


Can you give up some time to perform a random act of kindness this week and share your idea on Seesaw?
