<p>Reading: Children should be reading out loud to someone at home at least 3 times a week. In addition an activity should be completed to ensure understanding of the text. This is being monitored in school and the children will be rewarded for their efforts.</p>	<p>Spelling: Spellings may be set each week for children to practice rules and structures at home. This will be assessed in their writing and will not necessarily be assessed with a weekly spelling test.</p>	<p>Maths: Pupils must learn multiplication tables (up to 12×12). They should be practising their tables and the corresponding division facts every day. 'Hit The Button' and TTRS are great tools for practising at home.</p>
