



Famous English Building: Windsor Castle



- Windsor Castle is the world's oldest and largest inhabited castle and has been the family home of many British kings and queens for nearly 1000 years (including today by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II).
- William the Conqueror started building Windsor Castle in 1070 and took 16 years to finish it.
- On 20th November, 1992, the Great Fire at Windsor took 15 hours and 1.5 million gallons of water to put out. This was part of Queen Elizabeth II's 'Annus Horribilis'.

Famous Mexican Building:

Catedral Metropolitana

- It is the oldest and largest cathedral in Mexico
- It is made out of stone
